

Messages from Miss Maria

- **Pizza Friday-** This week we have a regular Friday, so pizza will be served for lunch. Please only send a morning snack (and afternoon snack if your child stays for afterschool care).
- Morning Snack Update- I am very pleased to inform everyone that we will be able to bring back our previous morning snack routine after Fall Break. Thank you for your patience as the school figured this situation out. Beginning after Fall Break, you will no longer have to pack your child a morning (AM) snack. The snack assignment will be sent out this upcoming week so that families will know what to send during their assigned week.
- Fall Break- During the week of 10/09-10/13, the school will be in Fall Break. This
 means that students with an EXTENDED DAY, ACADEMIC DAY, and HALF DAY
 contract will remain home. The school is open for ALL DAY contracts but there will be
 no instruction as all lead teachers will be on break as well. The students will be in their
 classrooms and will have fun fall-themed things to work with and other fun activities.
 There will be NO PIZZA served during Fall Break since not all the students will be
 attending. My assistants will be alternating days (they have the opportunity to take a
 break as well), so someone familiar will be with our students.
- Extra Clothes- If your child is sent home with soiled clothes in a bag, please remember to only send the article of clothing marked on the "WOOPS" slip attached to their bag of soiled clothes. The bins we use to store their clothes are not very large and if we have too many shirts, for example, it leave little room for the clothing we do need.



There is more to the skill of reading than knowing letter sounds and blending them together. I am often asked what can be done at home to support reading skills. My response is:

1. Be sure your child is a sensitive period for it. If they show a lot of interest in the moment, take advantage of it and do reading-related activities/games at home. If your child appears uninterested, it could simply mean that they are not ready YET. Learning to read should be an enjoyable experience, not forced.

2. You do not and should not need to buy the Montessori materials I use in class. If all the material used at home looks exactly like all of the material in school, then school becomes less interesting.

3. Turn regular games into language/reading games. If you play "I Spy", spy on the sounds of an object. You could say "I spy something that starts with the sound /p/".

BONUS: For math skills, if your child likes to pretend to shop with their toys, then put sticky notes with numbers as "price tags" (without the dollar sign) and then have your child bring that much "money" to buy the item (the "money" could be beads or beans, anything that they can count).

I am a HUGE fan of the resources provided by one of my favorite Montessorians, Marissa Frisk.
