CHILD-AS-TEACHER DAY

PARENT EXPECTATIONS

- Please arrive at least 5 minutes before your scheduled time. The children get nervous when they notice their visitors are not waiting outside when we open the door.
- Please wait on the black car line benches outside our classroom door. Your child will greet you and welcome you in.
- This event is for PARENTS/GUARDIANS only. Please be sure to plan alternative childcare for any younger siblings. We want to be able to provide as little distraction as possible when the "teachers" are presenting.
- Child-As-Teacher Day is a chance for your child to show you what they have been working on or simply enjoy doing in class. Some of the children may want to show how much they enjoy coloring and drawing, while others may want to show how they love to read.
- The children expect their observers (that is you) to watch with NO interruption until the lesson they are presenting is over. This ensures that your child does not lose their place or break their concentration while they are presenting. Please wait to be asked for help and hold questions until they are finished presenting.
- The children also expect their guests to follow the same rules they do: walking feet, indoor voices, pushing in chairs, etc. Please refrain from leaving personal belongings (like purses) on tables or shelves as they might be used by other children. If possible, please leave your belongings in your vehicle (except phones for pictures).
- Please avoid moving furniture around too much. Although standing is preferred when observing at a table, there are extra chairs, and I can help provide you with one. Please avoid taking a chair from another table in case a student decides to work at that table.
- Although I will be in the classroom, I will <u>MAINLY</u> be observing. I may

- also provide directions if I notice a child that is unsure of what to show. If you have questions, please email me after the event.
- Pictures and videos are welcome, but please be respectful of the other families and children. Please turn off the flash on your camera.
- The ODE will **NOT** be open during this event.
- In our classroom, to signal clean up time, the lights are turned off and a song is sung. The children will clean up and show you how to sit in our group circle to be dismissed.
- Please make your goodbyes <u>brief and quick</u>. Since we are on a tight schedule, it is very important not to linger so that the next group of parents can begin their turn promptly.

The children will be preparing very hard for this day and are extremely excited to share a glimpse of their day with their families in person. We look forward to seeing you and hope you enjoy your visit!
